

TOWN OF CLINTON DRIVEWAY PERMIT ORDINANCE

The Town Board of the Town of Clinton has adopted the following Driveway Permit Ordinance:

Section 1. Driveway Permit Ordinance

1.01 The establishment and installation of all roads and driveways from all public roads into private property shall be controlled by the Town Board. No public or private roads or driveways shall be installed, altered, or changed without first obtaining a permit authorizing the same. Changes include, but are not limited to widening, and changing grades. Normal maintenance procedures do not require a permit under this ordinance.

1.02 Such permit shall designate the location and a minimum width of 30 feet for such roadway or driveway, the proposed construction materials, the proposed amount, and type of traffic use, and the contractor's name.

1.03 There shall be a charge of \$20.00 for the permit required under this ordinance. The permit is valid for 30 days.

1.04 All driveways shall be constructed of suitable material for the amount and kind of traffic. The portions of any driveway within the public right-of-way shall be constructed of materials comparable to those of the public road, and shall be constructed in such a manner that no damage be done to the public road. All driveways shall be graded so that it will not be necessary to change the established grade of the public road. No driveway shall obstruct or interfere with the proper drainage of surface waters, and all culverts shall be of suitable size, material and condition for such purpose.

1.05 The applicant shall pay the cost of any such driveway with the town installing the first tube, only for residential driveways.

1.06 If, upon inspection, the Board determines that a driveway has not been constructed in substantial compliance with a permit, the Town may perform or order corrections to achieve compliance and charge the cost of correction to the landowner, the person who did the work, or both.

1.07 No permit shall be issued if the public safety, flow of traffic or condition of the Town roads would be endangered or impaired by the project in question.

Section 2. SEVERABILITY

Should any section, paragraph, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remainder of said ordinance shall not be affected hereby.

Section 3. EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall become effective and shall be in full force and effect from, and after its passage and publication, in the manner provided by law.
